





Summer Issues, Challenges, & Solutions


- Seasonal Police officers
 - (2024) Low recruitment numbers (Higher)
 - Only ten officers this summer (16+1)
 - (2024) Reduced presence in high population areas, boardwalk, Rehoboth Ave, Bandstand
 - (2024) What have we tried to increase recruitment?
 - Housing bonus, recruitment bonuses, retention bonus.
 - No recruitment bonuses were given out.
 - (2024) How are we adapting?
 - Active recruitment with applications stations on site.
 - All Star Talent and Guardian Alliance
 - (2024) Constraints
 - Housing
 - Officers returning to school in August



Summer Issues, Challenges, & Solutions

- Juveniles
 - (2024) Business and resident complaints about underage drinking, drug use, & trespassing.
 - (2024) Criminal violations; rape, robbery, felony theft, hate crime.
 - Focused efforts, result in juvenile arrests decreasing 57% since implementation of curfew.

UNACCOMPANIED JUVENILE

A juvenile, under the age of 18, unaccompanied by the juvenile's parent, guardian or caretaker.


§ 198-46 **Minors unaccompanied by adult prohibited from public places during certain hours.**

- A.** It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of 18 years to be on any public street or in a public place between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. unless accompanied by the juvenile's parent or guardian or unless engaged in, or traveling to or from, a business or occupation which the laws of this state authorize a juvenile to perform.
- B.** It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian to allow an unaccompanied juvenile to be on any public street or in any public place between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m.







Motor Vehicle Accidents



Driving Under the Influence



2.1.3 Vehicle Pursuits

Vehicle Pursuits

A written directive governing pursuit of motor vehicles, to include:

- a. evaluating the circumstances (road, weather, and traffic conditions and reason for the pursuit);
- b. initiating officer's responsibilities;
- c. designating secondary units' responsibilities;
- d. specifying roles and restrictions pertinent to marked, unmarked, or other types of police vehicles involvement in the pursuit;
- e. dispatcher's responsibilities and communication protocols;
- f. supervisor's responsibilities;
- g. using stopping techniques;
- h. specifying when to terminate pursuit;
- i. engaging in inter-jurisdictional and/or jurisdictional pursuits involving personnel from the agency and/or other jurisdictions; and
- j. establishing procedures for reporting and for an administrative review of the pursuit.

Current Projects

- Take Home Vehicle Program
 - Take home vehicles issued to all officers after 30 months of unblemished service with the agency.
 - Nine vehicle builds completed in 2025
 - Partnerships with BlueTech and Roger Signs & Graphics.
 - Two vehicle builds in progress slated for completion in Dec/Jan
 - All officers due take home vehicles have been issued one.


